1.	was a free man of color who fought in the Revolutionary War, was an ordained minister,
	and later settled in Raleigh, where he was a teacher to both white and black communities.
2.	After hiding in her grandmother's tiny attic for seven years, escaped enslavement in
	Edenton and published Incidents in the Life of a Slave Girl, Written by Herself in 1861.
3.	North Carolina's most successful cabinetmaker in the Antebellum (before the Civil War) time period,
	was a free man of color who employed whites, enslaved people, and free men of color in his workshop in Milton.
4.	Enslaved,, swam across three rivers in order to join the Union Army and fight for the end of
	slavery.
5.	Elected to the U.S. House of Representatives from North Carolina's Second District, served from
	1898 to 1901, when Jim Crow voting laws made re-election impossible.
6.	Born in Rocky Mount,''s family left North Carolina in 1922, for better opportunities in New
	York City. He became a leading jazz musician.
7.	Civil Rights leader was born in Asheville in 1922 and was the first African American student
	to attend UNC Chapel Hill's School of Law.
8.	graduated from Shaw University and was a Civil Rights leader who
	helped found the Student Non-Violent Coordinating Committee in 1960.
